ABOUT IMMA

Established in 1991 and based in its historic home at the Royal Hospital Kilmainham, IMMA is Ireland's National Cultural Institution for Modern and Contemporary Art. Our diverse and ambitious programme comprises exhibitions, commissions, and projects by leading Irish and international artists, as well as a rich engagement and learning programme which together provides audiences of all ages the opportunity to connect with contemporary art and unlock their creativity.

Set upon a Dublin hilltop overlooking the river Liffey in our beautiful 17th century building, we have carved out a space that is unique within contemporary culture over the past thirty years. It is a space in which the global and the local can connect, and one in which contemporary art and contemporary life can meet, challenge, and inspire one another. It is a space in which we go beyond passive observance of contemporary life, playing an active role in shaping it. It is our ambition to activate this space as a Catalyst for Change.

At the centre of our museum is the IMMA Collection; the nation's permanent Collection comprising some 4,500 works which exhibit enormous range and depth.

A Catalyst for Change


